

Experience the tradition of Afternoon Tea in the Parlor, dressing up for dinner, nightly dancing to the sounds of the Grand Hotel Orchestra, and sitting in a rocking chair on the world's longest porch with views of the Straits of Mackinac. This National Historic Landmark has always embraced its rich history. That means today, guests enjoy modern amenities while the hotel's original architecture and charm have been tastefully preserved. Contributing greatly to the hotel's ambiance is the relaxed atmosphere of Mackinac Island, where cars are not allowed and the horse and carriage and bicycle are favored modes of transportation. In 1947, the movie *This Time for Keeps* starring Esther Williams, was filmed at The Grand Hotel.













ACCOMMODATIONS

At Grand Hotel, no two rooms are alike. Every room and suite features its own design and ambiance and is categorized by size, location, and view — be it views of the interior, The Jewel Golf Course, or the Straits of Mackinac and the Mackinac Bridge. Additionally, each guest room is individually decorated and showcases a specific theme brought to life with colorful décor, historical memorabilia, curated paintings, and distinctive furnishings.

RESORT ACTIVITIES

With the variety of activities both at Grand Hotel and throughout Mackinac Island, there are lots of things to do for guests of all ages. Make your plans to experience everything offered — and make your stay as Grand as can be — by getting outdoors and experiencing the scenic beauty of Mackinac Island and the Grand Hotel grounds.

Golf on the Jewel. Awarded Editor's Choice "Best Grand & Boutique Golf Hotels" by Golf Digest, The Jewel is one of the most unique courses in Northern Michigan and the United States. As the only course in the country with horse-drawn carriage rides between nines, it truly is a Grand golf experience. The Jewel is the resort's 18-hole golf course. Separated by a mile-and-a-half, a leisurely 15-minute, horse-drawn carriage ride between the nines includes parts of the Island unseen by many visitors.

Swimming. The hotel has gone through an extensive renovation to transform the iconic Esther Williams Swimming Pool, named after the actress and competitive swimmer who starred in the 1947 movie, *This Time for Keeps*, filmed at Grand Hotel. Guests can enjoy a relaxing day at the pool and look forward to the addition of new state-of-the-art facilities and enhanced offerings on our grounds.

Biking. With more than 70 miles of natural and paved trails, Mackinac Island is the perfect place to get outdoors. Explore the interior of the island or the island's eight-mile perimeter on picturesque (and paved) Lake Shore Boulevard (M-185) — the only interstate in the nation that does not allow personal motor vehicles. Highlights along the way include Arch Rock, British Landing, Brown's Brook, Devil's Kitchen, and great views of the Straits of Mackinac and Mackinac Bridge.

On the northwest edge of Michigan's Lower Peninsula, this small beach town is a hub for foodies, wine connoisseurs, outdoor enthusiasts, and cherry lovers. Surrounded by water, towering forests, and gorgeous beaches, Traverse City is the perfect destination for a summer getaway.

Our preconvention adventure will begin Friday, June 10 with a sunset cruise from 8 - 9:30 p.m. along the Grand Traverse Bay of Lake Michigan. Then on Saturday, June 11, guests will enjoy tours of two area wineries from 10:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. Please keep in mind all times are Eastern Daylight Time.

Located on the 45th Parallel, Traverse City literally lines up with the most prestigious wine regions of Europe (think Bordeaux and Piedmont). They attribute their happy grapes to the natural insulation of Lake Michigan, fertile soil and long hours of sunlight for extended growing seasons which altogether makes the people pretty happy, too. The tour will include

private transportation to two of the areas most fantastic vineyards. You will experience tastings, lunch, and your own wine steward at each of the wineries. Upon your return to the hotel you will have time to unwind, relax and enjoy downtown Traverse City on your own.

On Sunday, travel to Mackinaw City to catch the ferry to beautiful Mackinac Island for the start of the 129th Annual Convention and Marketplace! The fee to participate in this excursion is \$400 and includes the Friday sunset cocktail cruise and the winery tours and lunch on Saturday. Only a limited number of spots are available for this opportunity!

Room reservations at The Grand

Rooms rates range from \$348 - \$468 per night. Taxes and fees include: 19.5% resort fee; 6% Michigan sales tax; 3% Mackinac Island assessment applies to the daily rate. There is also a one-time charge for



round-trip baggage transfer from the docks to the hotel and return. This baggage handling charge is currently \$10 per person. Within the hotel tipping is neither expected nor permitted. The hotel has a 30-day cancellation policy. You may cancel up to 30 days prior to arrival with a penalty of \$50. Cancellations 29 days or less prior to arrival will be charged 100% of the full deposit.

Rooms are reserved for registered convention guests only. Once registration fees are paid, guests will be sent a link to make reservations. The deadline to make room reservations is May 17. A two-night deposit is required at the time of booking for a stay of two or more nights. The deposit and the one time fee of \$10 per person for luggage transfers will be charged to the credit card provided. The balance will be charged 30 days prior to arrival.

EMPHASIS ON EDUCATION

History of a Timeless American Treasure Bob Tagatz

Bob Tagatz is The Grand Hotel's resident historian. This presentation will include a brief history of



Mackinac Island then delve into the fascinating early history of the Grand Hotel. You will hear how it first opened its doors in 1887 as a summer retreat for vacationers who traveled to Michigan by train, and came to Mackinac Island via steamer and boat and how generations since have successfully found a way to preserve an authentic historic resort experience. Tagatz has more than 30 years of civic experience in historical preservation in Michigan, Florida and Georgia. His particular area of interest is the study of turn-ofthe century wood frame hotels. He assembled the hotel's first archives and published a book and DVD on the history of Grand Hotel.

Cryptocurrency & the Blockchain: Digital Dollars or Counterfeit Currency Steve Stasiukonis

It's like money, highly controversial, it's not countrybacked, it's pseudo anonymous and becoming



popular across the planet. In this session, cryptocurrency and its management vehicle known as the Blockchain are explained. The session will also explain how

cryptocurrency is used for the purchase of anything like cars, homes, drugs and other illegal things. This session is an eve opener for anyone interested in digital currency, the technologies of Blockchain, and what you need to know as a financial person. Steve Stasiukonis serves as president of Secure Network Technologies, focusing on penetration testing, information security risk assessments, incident response and digital investigations. Steve Stasiukonis has worked in the field of information security for more than 15 years, specializing in the use of technology to identify information security vulnerabilities, assessing risk and the collection and interpretation of digital network intelligence. As a part of that experience, Steve is an expert in social engineering. He is listed in Wikipedia as one of the most notable social engineers and has written and demonstrated actual social engineering efforts involving pretexting, phishing and physically compromising banks, data centers and other highly secure operations and facilities.
